

Derek Woodruff AAF AIFD PFCI CF to present Today's Floral Design: Modern Mechanics and Design Styles to high school teachers during the TSFA event at AT&T Stadium

The landscape of floral design has gone through a drastic evolution in the last number of years. Design styles and mechanics are a focus of budding designers and consumers alike making our choices, as professionals, more important than ever. Buzzwords such as "sustainability" have brought the ecological impact of our industry to the forefront of the selection process when it comes to this consumable product. In this program, Derek will share new ways to adapt to the changing world of floral design for a new age, using modern mechanics, as well as how to use the principles and elements of design to create the ever-popular design styles of today.

In thinking of what subject matter might be most important to teachers, Derek shared

that "With a strong background in mechanics and hard goods combined with experiences with 'today's consumer' and with younger/fresher designers, I think it is important to branch out from what we know about classic floral design training to appeal to a broader new audience of students and evolve with what floral design is today."

While Derek was a student in floral design at the Jackson Area Career Center, their curriculum was based on the Michigan Certified Florist Program and we were encouraged to attend the Great Lakes Floral Expo. With this excellent guidance from his teachers, he participated in his first floral design competition, as a student, and won! He got the bug and continued his floral education. Upon graduation from high school with a full time job at a flower shop, he became a Certified Floral Designer. This accomplishment led to many more accomplishments, such as winning numerous floral design competitions, becoming AIFD, and even being selected to compete on a floral design reality television show!

When asked about his first experience with flowers Derek shared, "Thinking back to my first flower experience, I recall that when I was a kid, my dad would take me to the garden center in the spring and let me choose the annuals we would plant in our beds and boxes at our house. This was my first experience with designing with flowers. Fast forward to high school, I was interested in plant sciences, which brought me to our local career center. Their plant science program specialized in both floral design and landscape architecture. Floral design definitely sounded more fun, and I would learn more about plants."

Derek is looking forward to being with Texas high school teachers who make an incredible difference in floral design education. TSFA is equally excited about bringing him to Texas to present during a TSFA sponsored event at AT&T Stadium in conjunction with the Agriculture Teachers Association of Texas Conference.






